"We Hongkongers" Rolling Survey

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Background

"We Hongkongers" was advocated by Hong Kong Public Opinion Program (HKPOP) of the Hong Kong Public Opinion Research Institute (HKPORI), with the support of many members of the civic society. With reference to the petition website "We the People" hosted by the White House of the United States, "We Hongkongers" aims to reflect public sentiment by conducting scientific research on any issues raised by Hong Kong citizens. If any person can mobilize more than 10,000 "petitions", his or her suggested questions would be included in the survey after verification. The rolling survey of "We Hongkongers" started officially on 17 October 2019, with a target sample size of at least 334 per rolling day. Report No.3 (this report) covers the survey period of 25 to 31 October 2019, and the following 5 questions have completed at least one rolling point with three consecutive rolling days of fieldwork within the period mentioned:

- Q1: There are views in the society saying the 7.21 incident involved collusion of the Police Force and triads. How much do you agree or disagree with this view?
- Q2: There are views in the society saying there are Chinese People's Police or People's Armed Police Force in the Police Force. How much do you believe in this view?
- Q3: The U.S. Congress is reviewing the Hong Kong Human Rights and Democracy Act, which would sanction people thought to have infringed human rights in Hong Kong. How much do you support or oppose this Act?
- Q4: Some people initiated a non-cooperation movement, which involved actions such as blocking traffic and going on strike, to push the government to respond to their demands. How much do you support or oppose the non-cooperation movement?
- Q5: Some people initiated changes in consumption patterns, such as boycotting or supporting selected brands or shops to express their views toward the anti-extradition law protests. How much do you support or oppose such behavior?

Other than listing the survey result of these questions within the survey period mentioned, this report also shows for readers' easy reference the previous result of these questions ever since the beginning of our "We Hongkongers" rolling survey.

Survey Findings

^[1] Before September 2017, "overall response rate" was used to report surveys' contact information. Starting from September 2017, "effective response rate" was used. In July 2018, POP further revised the calculation of effective response rate. Thus, the response rates before and after the change cannot be directly compared.

^[2] All error figures in this release are calculated at 95% confidence level, meaning that if we were to repeat a certain survey 100 times with different random samples, we would expect 95 times having the population parameter within the respective error margins calculated. Because of sampling errors, when quoting percentages, journalists should refrain from reporting decimal places, whereas one decimal place can be used when quoting rating figures.
