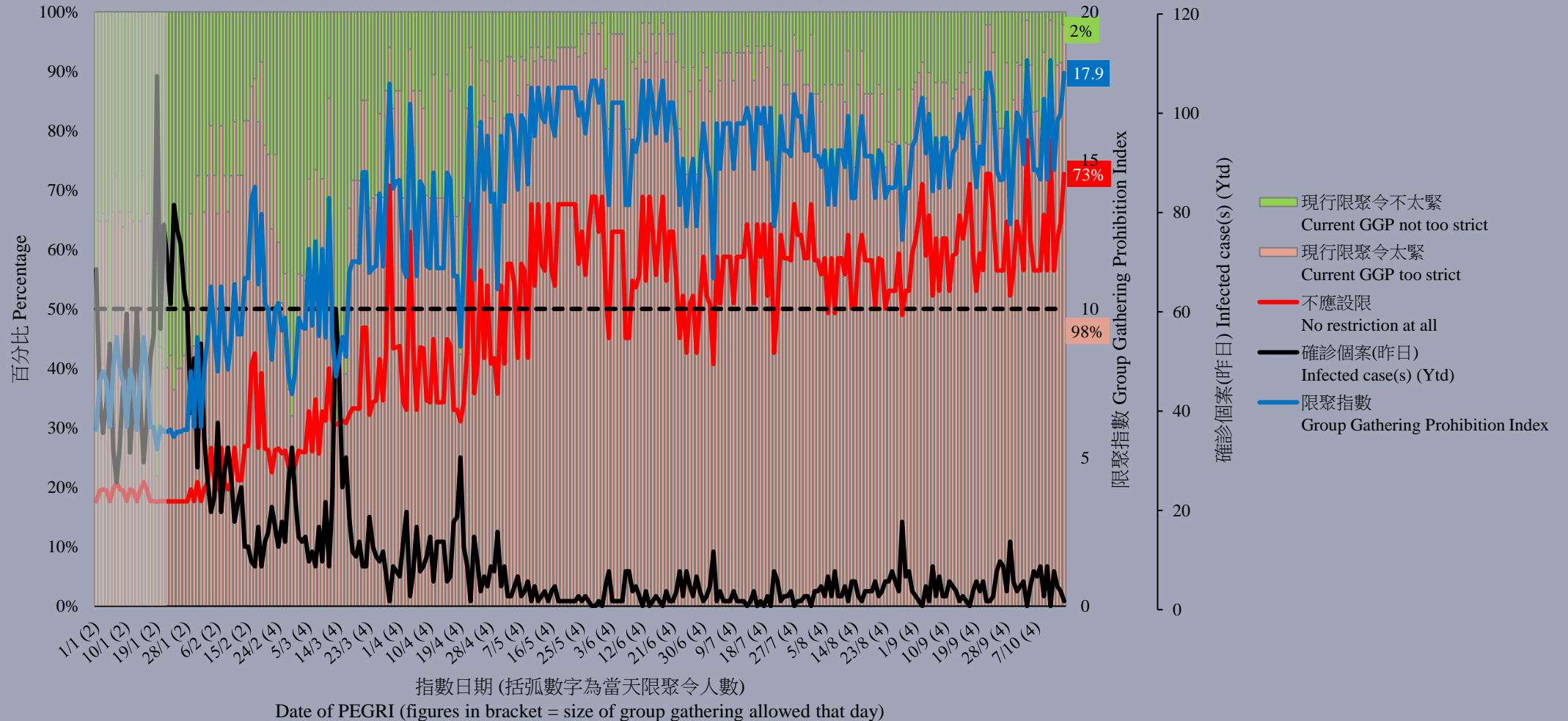


Group Gathering Prohibition Index – Commentary

民生大聯盟發言人章彤輝博士指出，「今年10月除了假期較多，更有消費券加持，因此市面經濟相當活躍，近350億的消費券對飲食和零售業無疑是一支強心針。連帶保就業計劃，政府庫房額外支出了1200億，約為其年收入的20%，可惜這不是可持續的施政手段。未來政府如何開源以健全和優化經濟環境，還是不可迴避的挑戰。」

Dr Tung-fai Cheung, Spokesman of Alliance of Revitalizing Economy and Livelihood, observed, “With the excitement of consumption voucher scheme and more holidays in October, local business has been quite juicy now. Catering and retail industries definitely benefited from the scheme and relieved for a while. The treasury already spent extra 120 billions for the schemes of consumer voucher and employment support, which is about 20% of the annual government’s revenue. Thus, it is not likely a sustainable policy. The challenge remains and the government needs to rejuvenate the economy for more sustainable incomes.”

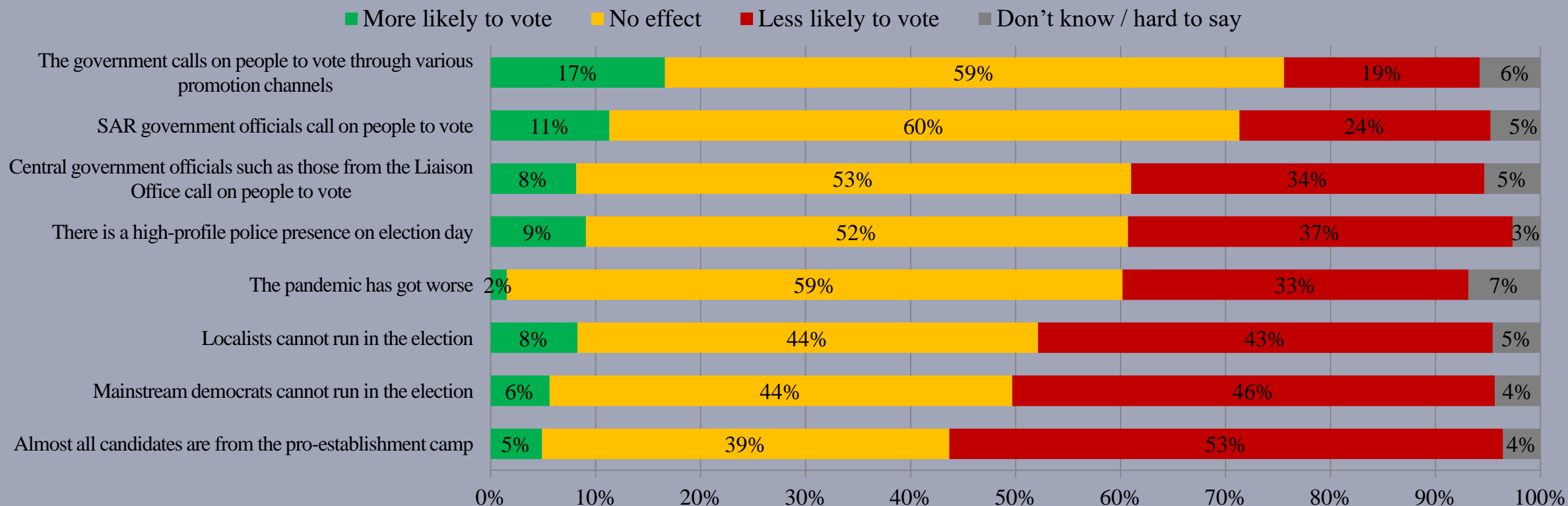

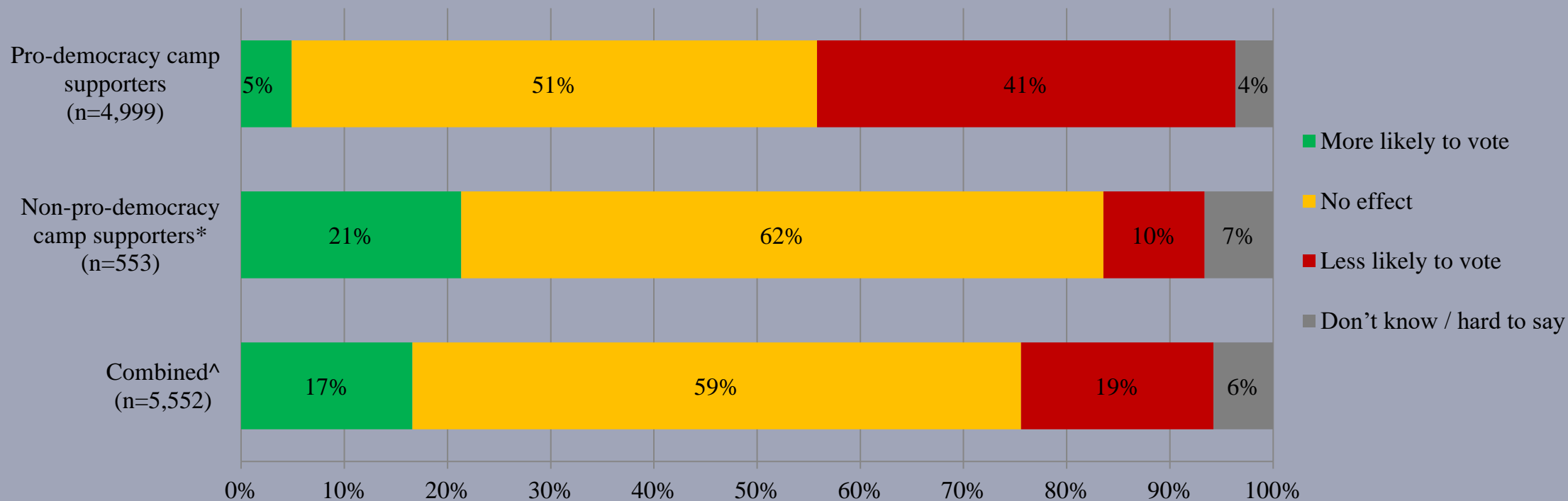

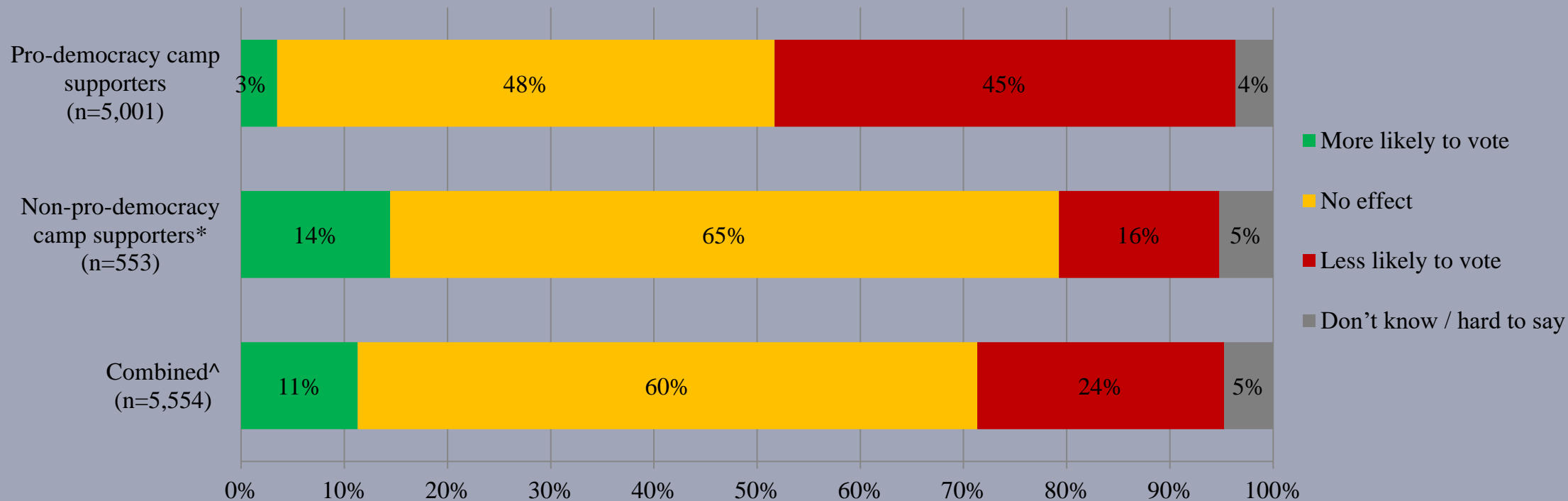

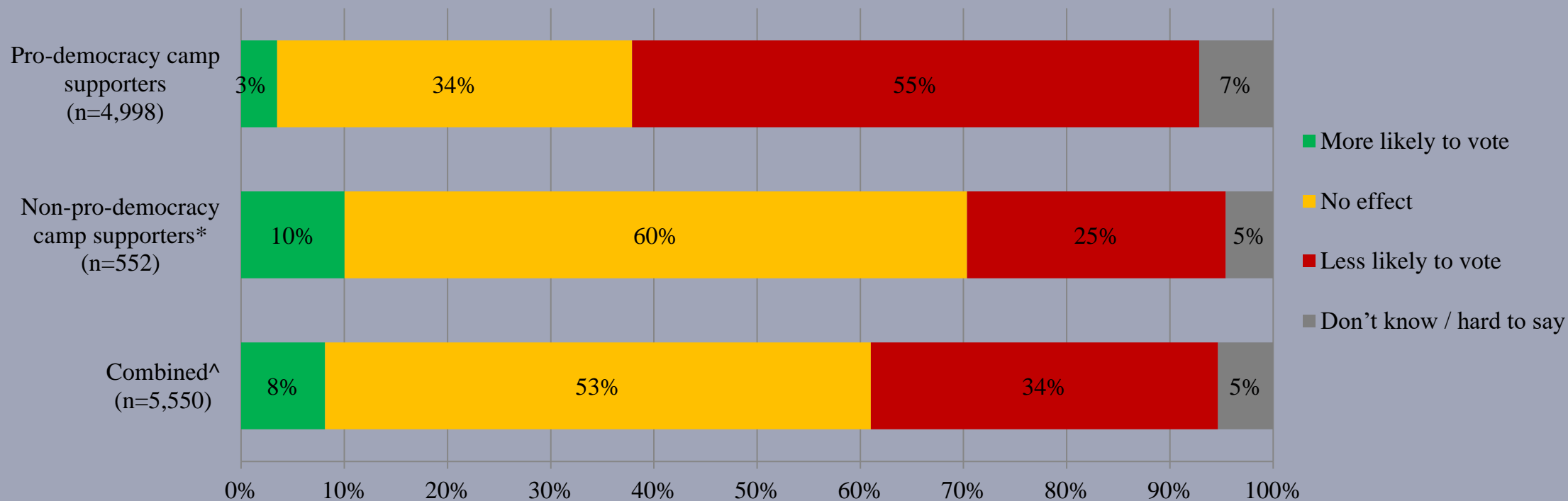

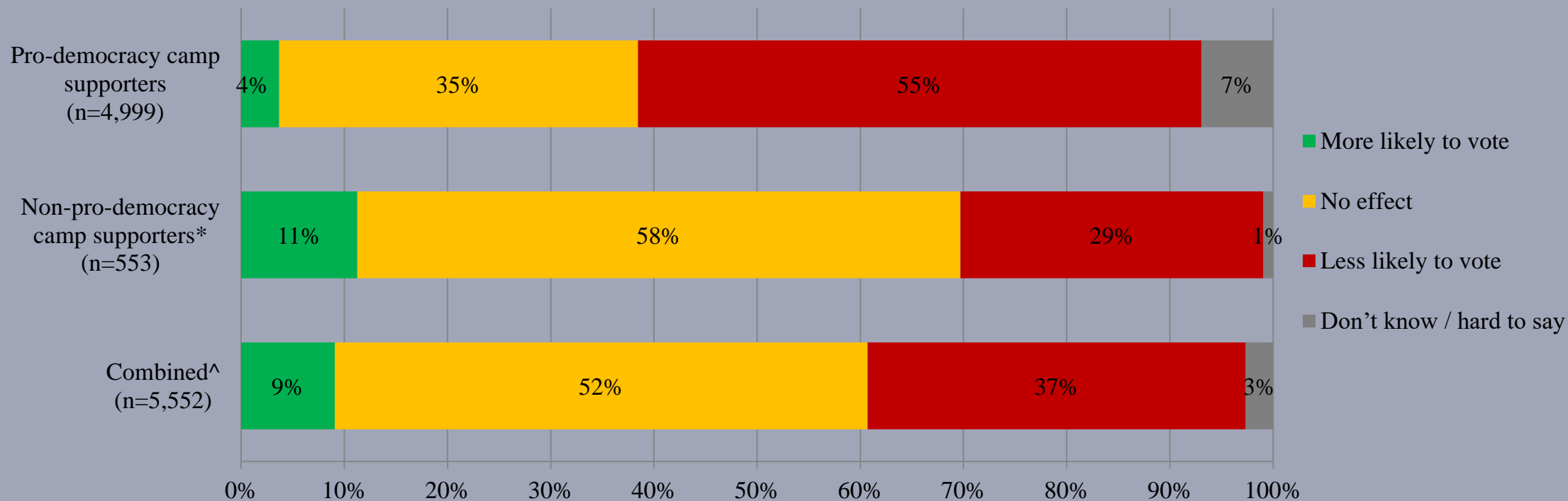

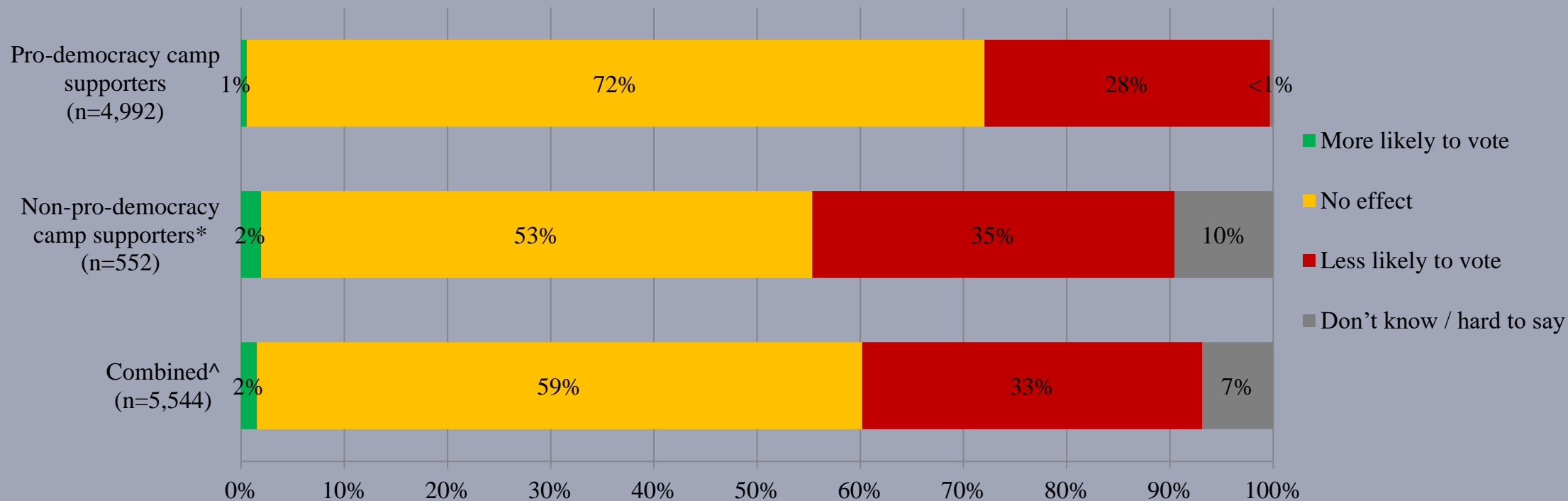

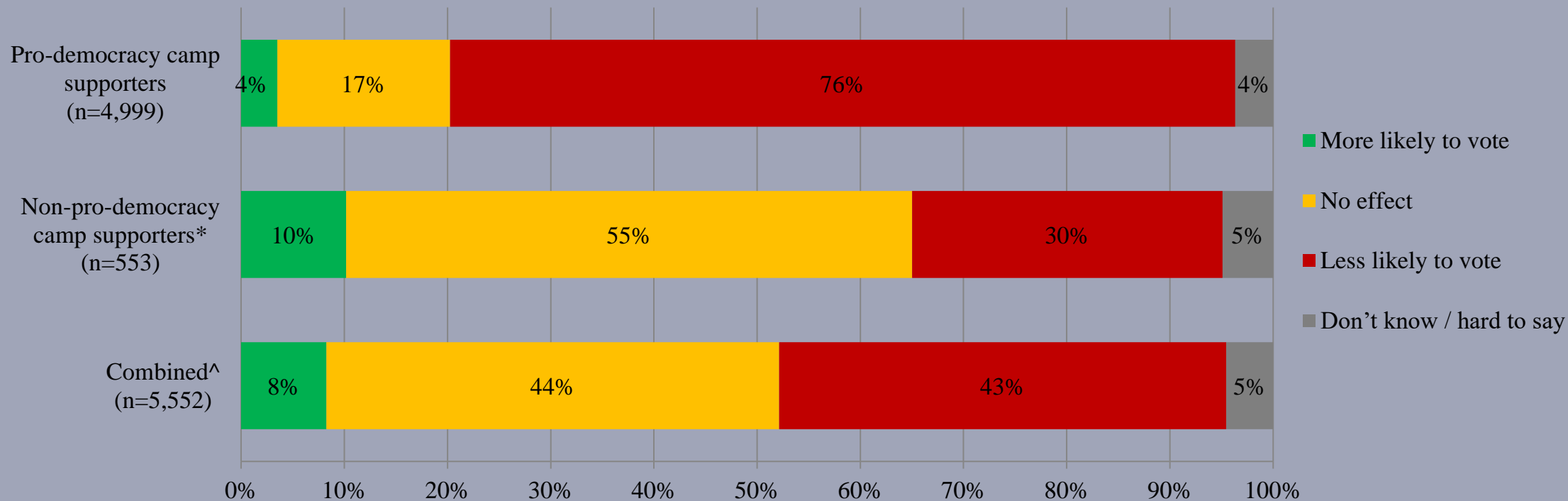

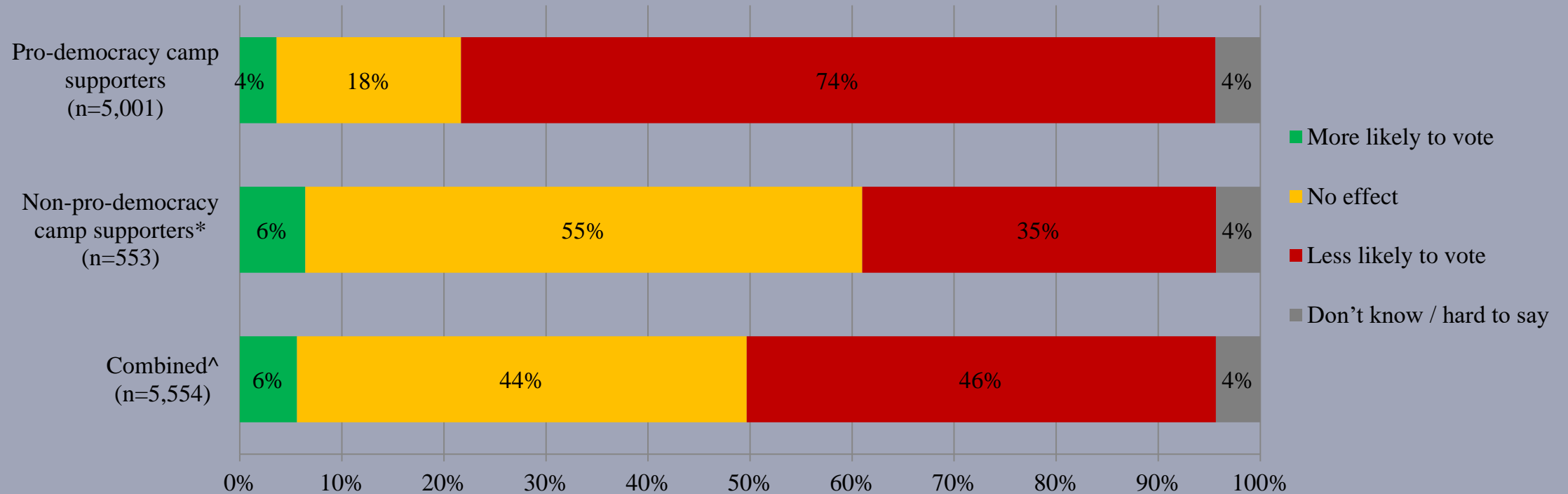

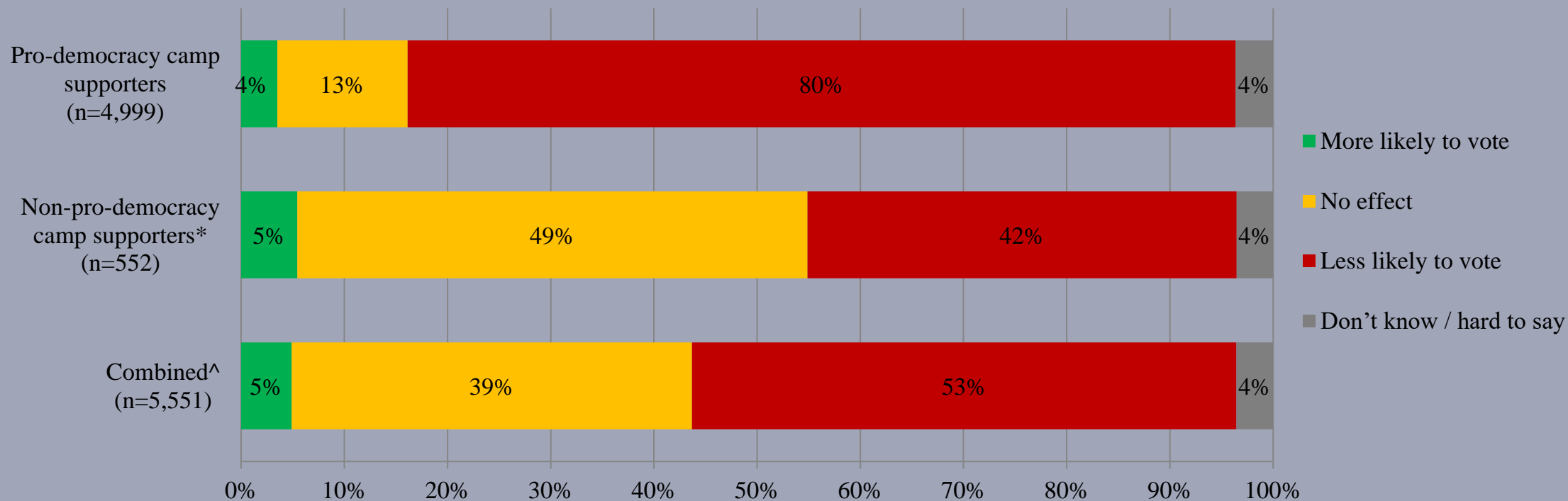
