

限聚指數 – 分析評論 Group Gathering Prohibition Index – Commentary

獨立評論人潘麒智指出:「新冠疫情緩和,確診個案維持低水平,政府放寬社交距離、餐飲聚會等防疫措施,大部分社交距離措施延長14天,直至10月27日。早前特首發表施政報告提及年底或將『通關碼』和『安心出行』合併,不排除要求全民安裝,為通關做準備。與此同時,多國面對疫情持續,已放棄確診『清零』策略,改與病毒共存。本人再次建議特區政府參考相關處理手法,為全球全面通關做準備,而非無止境追求清零,令香港困在死胡同當中。」

Independent commentator KC Poon observed, "The coronavirus epidemic in Hong Kong subsides while the confirmed cases remain low. The government has extended most of the social distancing and catering measures for 14 days until October 27. The Chief Executive mentioned in her policy address that she might merge the 'travel code' and 'LeaveHomeSafe' at the end of the year, and did not rule out the possibility of requiring universal installation to prepare for the travel resumption. At the same time, many countries have abandoned the strategy of 'zero infection' amid the ongoing epidemic, and have adopted the 'coexistence with the virus' strategy instead. I suggest again that the SAR Government should make reference to the relevant measures to prepare for global travel resumption, instead of endlessly pursuing 'zero infection', which would trap Hong Kong in a dead end."

 Starry Lee, Regina Ip, Junius Ho, Priscilla Leung, Michael Tien and Alice Mak were the top 6 councillors being mentioned most frequently, they therefore entered the rating survey.

• The latest survey shows that Alice Mak obtains a rating of 34.2 marks, but is dropped due to her relatively low recognition rate. The rating of Priscilla Leung has increased significantly by 4.2 marks compared with the last survey, while that of Michael Tien has registered record low since he was first rated in 2013.
