Reference: December 18, 2020 Press Conference Explanation of the Research Background

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- Advocated by HKPORI, with reference to the petition website "We the People" hosted by the White House of the United States
- The rolling survey series under the "We Hongkongers" Project was carried out in 2019, a total of 12 reports were published from October to December.
- In mid-May 2020, "We Hongkongers Panel Survey" is launched and survey data are collected from HKPOP Panel samples, including Hong Kong People Representative Panel (Probability-based Panel) and Hong Kong People Volunteer Panel (Non-probability-based Panel) in the form of online questionnaire
- HKPOP sent out emails to all panel members at the beginning of the survey, inviting them to fill in the questionnaire at the designated online platform. Members were allowed to make repeated submissions, while only the last submission of each individual member would be used for analysis.
- HKPOP adopts a rim-weighting method involving seven variables, namely, gender, age, educational attainment, economic activity status, district, voting record and rating of Chief Executive
- Survey results are presented by political camp such as "Pro-democracy camp supporters" and "Non-pro-democracy camp supporters", and then adjusted the by-group weighted figures using ratio of "pan-democratic" vs "non-pan-democratic" collected in regular tracking survey to give the aggregated figures
- HKPOP also regularly compares the panel survey results with telephone survey results.

- Advocated by HKPORI, with reference to the petition website "We the People" hosted by the White House of the United States
- The rolling survey series under the "We Hongkongers" Project was carried out in 2019, a total of 12 reports were published from October to December.
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- HKPOP sent out emails to all panel members at the beginning of the survey, inviting them to fill in the questionnaire at the designated online platform. Members were allowed to make repeated submissions, while only the last submission of each individual member would be used for analysis.
- HKPOP adopts a rim-weighting method involving five variables, namely, gender, age, electors by geographical constituencies, political inclination and rating of Chief Executive.
- The raw data are rim-weighted by the figures obtained from the Hong Kong Census and Statistics Department and/or Registration and Electoral Office so that the marginal distribution of the sample in terms of gender, age and electors by geographical constituencies would match with that of the general population figures from the Registration and Electoral Office. The marginal distribution of the sample in terms of political inclination and "rating of Chief Executive" would match that of the general population in HKPOP's regular tracking surveys.



復興經濟民生大聯盟成員任偉豪指出:「新冠病毒經歷了多次變種,今次到了 Omicron 登場。多間藥廠均宣佈需為 Omicron 重新研發針對性的疫苗,因舊的疫苗 作用不大。港府正在谷針的復必泰和科興疫苗,是只針對最原始的版本研發出來的。當不斷有新變種出現的時代,谷針的目的除了交數和安心之外,對真正防疫似乎沒有多大作用。」

Yam Wai Ho, member of Alliance of Revitalizing Economy and Livelihood observed, "The virus has undergone many mutations, and this time it has come to Omicron to debut. Pharmaceutical companies have announced the need to re-develop targeted vaccines for Omicron, because the old vaccines have little effect. BioNTech and Sinovac vaccines are only developed for the most original version. In an era when new variants are constantly appearing, the purpose of vaccination, apart from making numbers and peace of mind, does not seem to have much effect on real epidemic prevention."

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

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

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

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

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
